Why Cub Scouting?

Cub Scouting's strength is that it is a well-rounded program positively affecting every area of a child's life.

Cub Scouting encourages children to achieve a deeper appreciation of others, including peers, parents, and other adults. Early in their Cub Scouting experience, children learn the value of helping others.

Cub Scouting provides children with a sense that they are important as individuals. They learn that their Scouting family cares about what happens to them.

Cub Scouting promotes activities that lead to personal responsibility, high self-esteem and character development. The Cub Scout program is family-based and will strengthen the bond between children and their guardians.



What Does Cub Scouting Cost?

Families are responsible for a \$33 BSA registration fee, and also for purchasing a uniform. Cub Scouts are also encouraged, but not required, to subscribe to *Boys' Life* magazine. A one-year subscription costs \$12.

Cub Scout Packs normally charge nominal dues and earn income by working on approved fundraising projects such as our annual popcorn sale. These projects help fund the Cub Scout Pack's activities for the entire year. Upon request, some financial assistance may be available for families.

*Fees will be collected by the Pack leaders. Checks and cash accepted.

How Does Cub Scouts Work?

Your child joins a den. A den usually consists of six to eight children of the same grade who meet accordingly to their schedules. An adult den leader (usually a parent) is in charge of the activities, which include games, crafts, projects, ceremonies and lots of fun. A Cub Scout Pack meets at least once a month and consists of all the dens. The Cubmaster leads Pack meetings which are made up of fun activities, as well as the presentation of awards that the children have earned during the month.



Cub Scout Outdoor Opportunities

Dens go on field trips to interesting places in the community. Cub Scouts can go to day camp or resident camp where they experience a variety of outdoor fun and special activities geared toward their age groups, such as **archery, bb guns, field sports, fishing, swimming, crafts, and special attractions**. District-organized events and Pack overnights are other ways to have fun camping with other Cub Scouts and their families.
