Helpful Hints for First Timers & Old Pros

Equipment

Students are more than welcome to bring their own equipment to the hill. The school has no locked area for storage of equipment and is not responsible for lost or stolen articles, but students who bring their equipment can store it upstairs in gym A. Parents may also drop off any equipment right after school. Please ensure that you have tried on all equipment to ensure it still fits and is safe!

It is highly recommended that all students wear a helmet. Helmets are required when renting equipment and are included in the price. If using your own equipment, helmets are available for rental at the hill.

Lessons

Never been skiing or snowboarding before? Nordic Mountain now offers lessons at NO COST to anyone who's interested! Students interested in lessons should see chaperones or Nordic Mountain personnel at the hill for more direction. Lessons are highly recommended for first-timers. Check out Nordic Mountain's website for more info-Learn to ski/snowboard-Terrain Based Learning-watch the videos!

Food & Drink

Students are more than welcome to pack snacks or a bag lunch as we will be at the hill over the dinner hour. Enjoying food & drink on the bus is a privilege we will be allowed to enjoy as long as students clean up after themselves and keep the bus clean! There are concessions available at the hill as well. The pub menu and pricing is available on Nordic Mountain's website.

What to Wear

Dress in layers! This is a winter sport and we will be skiing even in below zero wind chills. It is much better to be too warm than too cold. Layers will allow you to remove clothing as your body generates heat from exertion. Students will have some time to change and add layers after school. Pay attention to the hands and feet especially- they're the first to get cold!

	Start with a base layer made of synthetic moisture wicking material
	Warm socks made of synthetic material
	Water-Resistant Jacket & Snow/ Ski Bibs or Pants
	Waterproof ski gloves or mittens
	Hat or Helmet- again, helmets are required when renting and absolutely recommended for all!
What to Bring	
A smal	bag packed with some snow sport essentials can guarantee a more enjoyable trip. Here are our recommendations:
	Goggles. They are essential for warmth and visibility- especially when it's really cold.
	A backup pair of gloves in case the first pair gets wet.
	A pair of hand warmers to stick in the gloves or pocket for quick warm ups.
	Lip Balm- multiple trips down the slopes can really do a number on the lips!
	Some cash for a drink or snack while you warm up in the lodge.

Electronics

Electronics are allowed on the bus. Please keep in mind that the bus is not locked while we are at the hill and River View Middle School, Kobussen Busses, and Brandon Sanderfoot are <u>not</u> responsible for lost or stolen electronics.

Winter Weather & Cancellations

We try if at all possible to keep the dates scheduled as planned due to the many other commitments students and families have. One make up date is pre-built into the calendar. If a cancellation is necessary, it will most likely be made on the day of the event. Cancellations will be posted on our Facebook page.

Remember, this is a winter sport and it will be cold. It is important that students wear clothes designed to keep them warm and dry. They are also allowed to take warm up breaks at any time. You as the parent make the final decision about whether to keep your child home, but please be aware that no vouchers or refund monies will be issued. As a general rule of thumb, Ski Club MAY BE cancelled if wind chill exceeds -25 degrees, or if weather conditions will make travel hazardous. If school is cancelled, Ski Club will be cancelled as well.
