Earn college credit and save time and money with these simultaneous-enrollment courses

Why give it
a try?

Kaukauna High School offers three different ways to earn credits toward post-secondary education: AP, CAPP and FVTC Dual-Enrollment. Students can earn credit for college taking courses at the high school — that means money saved, and advanced standing at many universities.



Students take a free, college-level courses, taught by a KHS teacher, and may, upon completion, choose to take a nationally administered exam to earn college credit.

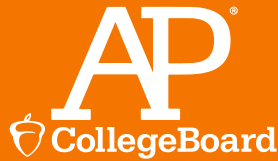


Courses offered in cooperation with FVTC may be taken for technical college credit or advanced university standing. These credits may also meet KHS graduation credit.

During the 2020-2021 school year, Kaukauna High School students earned 3,647 post-secondary credits, worth an estimated \$773,000.

AP tests, which generally cost around \$95 per test, are administered at the high school. Students are able to take their college-level tests in the comfort of their high school classrooms.

During the 2020-2021 school year, nearly 60% of student who chose to take the AP exam received a 3 or higher, earning them credits toward a degree at most Universities; collectively, they earned 213 college credits, worth over \$90,000 based on the cost of a 3-credit class at a Wisconsin 4-year institution.

Of those students who took AP exams, ten of them were named AP Scholars, three of them as Scholars with Honor and two as Scholars with Distinction.

This year, student will have additional opportunities for practice testing at the high school, and with the addition of Flex Time to the daily schedule, will have increased access to teachers and additional opportunities for face-to-face review time, closing the gap for those courses offered in trimesters 1 and 2.

CAPP (Cooperative Academic Partnership Program) is designed to provide students with an opportunity to enroll at the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh as a student, while taking their classes in a high school setting; all class credits earned are reflected on both college and high school transcripts.

Taking CAPP courses is strongly recommended for students intending to pursue a 4-year university degree. According to the University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh website, the average price per credit hour for Wisconsin residents at UW-Oshkosh is \$306.33. During the 2020-2021 school year, the 144 students that took part in CAPP courses earned a total of 909 college credits ... worth nearly \$300,000.

UW-Oshkosh CAPP is the only concurrent enrollment program in Wisconsin accredited through the National Alliance of Concurrent Enrollment Partnerships (NACEP) — a professional organization for high schools and colleges that fosters rigorous concurrent enrollment.
