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SUPERINTENDENT'S CORNER

STRONG MINDS, STRONG HEARTS, STRONG STUDENTS.

I begin this school year, my 31st in public education and 7th as Superintendent of Kaukauna Area School District, inspired by all of you to continuously improve — on both an individual level and as a community. Personally, I enter this year with a renewed, steady focus on student success and the learning process that gets us there. As a community, extensive school improvement initiatives are creating safe, enjoyable learning conditions in which our students can challenge themselves and grow. This summer, River View led the way, with major energy efficiency projects, including upgrades to heating, ventilation, roofs and lighting; redesigned parking lots are enhancing student safety

at Haen, EQ and KHS; and in the spirit of the mindset of continuous improvement, we have more work to do.

KASD is deeply involved in a Master Planning process, focusing on grade-level configuration for 4K-4 and learning spaces for 4K-8 school buildings. All questions around this process focus on student success and the learning needs of our staff and students. The spirit of "Strong Minds-Strong Hearts-Strong Students" united spaces with the anduring heliof in our Kaukauna Strong

unites seamlessly with the enduring belief in our **Kaukauna Strong** culture. We will continue to work for our students — providing the best opportunities to lead them down the path toward success. There are exciting days ahead of us, KASD.

ENHANCING SCHOOL SAFETY

KASD SECURES GRANT FUNDS FOR UPGRADES

The Kaukauna Area School District will soon see a number of significant building security updates, thanks to the \$146,240 School Safety Grant awarded by the Wisconsin Department of Justice in July 2018. KASD was one of 147 Wisconsin school districts to receive grant funds, now totaling more than \$10 million statewide.

These secured funds will cover the costs for shatter-resistant film for each school's main entrance, as well as upgrades/additions to our schools' camera systems.

"We would like to extend our sincere 'thank you' to all that were involved in this process," stated Superintendent Mark Duerwaechter. "These upgrades will be welcome additions to the regular work already being done in all of our buildings to ensure the safety of our students."

KASD has applied for a second round of grants, the funds secured from which will benefit adolescent mental health training programs, secure door devices and additional safety and security mechanisms within our schools.

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This year, Abel Insurance partnered with Kobussen Buses, Ltd. and Ghost Town Fitness to fill the bus with school supplies for our students. Abel Insurance and Ghost Town Fitness served as drop-off points for collections, running a friendly competition between the two, in which Ghost Town Fitness came through with the most items donated. Kobussen Buses, Ltd. donated an even larger bus than last year to accommodate the generous number of donations from throughout the community.

ENERGY EFFICIENCY UPGRADES

ADDRESS NEEDS, GOALS

There's no denying that it has been a "messy" summer within Kaukauna Schools. And while there have been a number of very visible energy efficiency upgrades happening within the District this summer, Kaukauna Area School District has truly been working for a *number* of years on energy efficiency projects that are allowing us to use less power ... environmentally-friendly and fiscally-responsible progress.



Kaukauna Area School District has implemented several natural gas conservation measures over the past 10 years. New boiler systems, upgrades to insulation with new roofing systems, and enhanced use of an automated heating and ventilating system has allowed KASD to greatly reduce natural gas costs. In 2007-2008 KASD spent \$366,000 on natural gas consumption.



During the 2017-2018 school year, the District spent \$159,000 — **\$207,000 less on heating buildings** than the year prior. Natural gas prices have aided in the cost reduction, but not to the full extent of the savings.

With River View Middle School's upgraded heating system, we expect further cost reductions moving forward.

Despite rising utility costs over the past decade, Kaukauna Area School District paid \$28,000 less for electricity in 2017-2018 than it did during the 2007-2008 fiscal year. The pursuit of becoming an Energy Star District has kept utility costs in check. In 2008, Kaukauna Schools used 4,035,425 kilowatt hours of electricity. By 2017, the District had reduced its consumption to 3,216,002 kWh; *that's a 20% reduction in energy use,* despite the addition of several new athletic fields and practice areas on District property.



Kaukauna Area School District will continue to look at ways to increase energy efficiency within both buildings and practices, as they move forward with the additional upgrades to buildings that will continue into the Summer of 2019.



"Over the past decade, KASD has made great strides in creating energy-efficient buildings. Energy use, be it natural gas or electricity, is way down; costs are also down. By utilizing the tools available and staying on the edge of technology, the District has been able to take funds that were previously dedicated to utilities and push those dollars into classrooms. In the end, we've provided a better environment for students and staff to be in on a daily basis, while pushing funding, the main reason the District is in business — truly a win-win for all."

FOR STRONGER SCHOOLS

Since diving into the Master Planning process, the Kaukauna Area School District has accomplished a lot: learning, exploring, sharing and growing.



As you may recall, in August 2017, after renewing our commitment to our District's vision and to our schools, KASD partnered with Eppstein Uhen Architects (EUA) and Miron Construction as part of a Master Planning process. For the next several months, our team worked through an initial education process, examining our existing facilities, configuration and learning spaces to understand and define the current realities related to our District's educational adequacy, accessibility and building capacity and utilization.



"As we continue to grow, we need to ensure that our learning facilities, environments and configuration match the instructional needs of our students and staff, align with the District's strategic goals and uphold the values and priorities of our community. This is Kaukauna Strong."

In March 2018, KASD entered into the next phase of the process, calling for members of our school community to join the our Facilities Action Team. In partnership with EUA and Miron Construction, our 70-person-strong Action Team, comprised of KASD staff, parents and community members, spent much of April, May and June exploring ways to better align District needs with both existing infrastructure and potential new options. The teams, separated into two groups — one to address configuration and learning spaces at the elementary level and the other to address learning spaces at River View — are working to explore, research and develop dynamic, conceptual plans and high-level cost estimates to address both immediate and long-range facility needs.

As our Action Teams continue the process of refining facility options, we are asking for your help; the voice of the KASD community is essential in this process. Please join us for one of two **Community Reaction Workshops** in October to respond to the work that has been done so far, and help us better refine our preliminary options. A community-wide survey will also be released to all District households in November, to gather additional feedback on preliminary solutions that may be advanced to the community for a potential April 2019 vote.

We will continue to listen to our staff and our community, to learn, to grow, and to keep moving along this path toward success. We look forward to hearing *your* voice at our Community Reaction Workshops!
