School Profile 2020-2021

Kaukauna High School (KHS) is a 9-12 Division I school providing education for approximately 1215 students. Our student population consists of 24% Low Income students (qualify for Free/Reduced Lunch per Federal Guidelines) and 87% Caucasian and 13% Non-Caucasian. The academic school year consists of three trimesters of study, each consisting of approximately 60 days and ending with a period of two days for final examinations. Extra-curricular activities help our students round out their education experience, including 22 student organizations and clubs and an athletic program that is second to none with 21 sports offered.

Diversified Curriculum and Specialized Programs

Kaukauna High School provides a diversified curriculum, which inspires advanced placement (AP), accelerated courses, CAPP (Cooperative Academic Partnership Program) through UW Oshkosh, Early College Credit program, and co-op/Youth Apprenticeship programs with local businesses. In addition, Kaukauna High School offers many classes with transcribed credit at Fox Valley Technical College and University of Wisconsin Oshkosh. All of these opportunities help challenge and prepare students for a competitive world.

School Community

Students and parents are served by 77 certified staff, including one Principal, two Associate Principals, one Activities Director, one Dean of Students, four school counselors, two school psychologists, one school social worker, one school nurse, 23 educational support personnel, and four administrative assistants.

Curriculum

Kaukauna High School has a focused, building-wide commitment to achievement. Kaukauna High School utilizes a leadership team comprised of teachers, counselors, and administrators to design and help implement school-wide school improvement. The interdisciplinary team uses student performance data from both nationally normed and local sources to guide our annual professional development. The team uses STAR, ASPIRE, ACT, local grades and placement tests as sources of data to implement our focused work to improve our individual teacher's art and science of teaching and learning. The focus on literacy for all students continues to be at the core of our work. The literacy plan was written and is being implemented by staff members. There have been extensive staff development opportunities, building-level in-services, peer coaching and brown-bag discussions at department and building levels.

Kaukauna High School has high quality, rigorous and relevant instruction. All students are offered a rich, diverse curriculum. We offer challenges for students of all abilities in each year of their high school experience. Three different options are available for students who want to get a head start on college education. All of the following classes are offered to our students at KHS and all carry some degree of advancement beyond our traditional (*high school credit only*) offerings.

Our Early College Credit and Start College Now programs allow students who have exhausted our existing high school curriculum to take classes at district expense at post-secondary institutions in a wide variety of subject areas. Our Family and Consumer Education, Business Information Technology, and Career & Technical Education programs attract students of all ability levels. All students are eligible to participate in a Cooperative Work Experience program, which includes classroom and on-site experiences. Special Education students are also eligible to participate in a Work-based Learning Environment that develops life skills and enhances employability. Our At Risk program has been in place for decades and offers students a nurturing, on-site curriculum taught by subject level experts, while still having access to the full catalog of course offerings. We continue to improve our curriculum to meet the needs of students through a process that involves first the building, then the district and the school board.

COVID-19

Kaukauna Area School District closed all of its physical campuses on March 13, 2020 in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. On March 16th 2020, Kaukauna High School went to a virtual learning model. The grading system was changed to offer families the choice of a "P" for pass or the letter grade that the student earned in each individual class. As the COVID-19 pandemic continued into the 2020-2021 school year, families were given 3 options for their child's schooling while at Kaukauna High School. Those options include:

- A blended model where students attended KHS for 2 days per week and were online for 3 days
- 100% virtual option utilizing Kaukauna High School faculty for instruction
- 100% virtual utilizing Wisconsin Virtual School instructors while remaining a KHS student.
